Local Government

From 1 February 2023, full-time, part-time and casual employees (excluding those employed by small business employers) will be entitled to access 10 days of paid FDV leave per year.

These changes bring domestic family and sexualised violence to the forefront in the workplace and bring the onus on all of us to play a part in building our understanding and our responses.
