

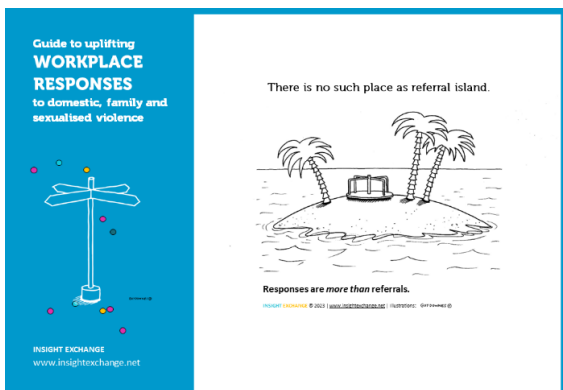
Local Government Workplace Responses

In 2020 we released an [Insights Paper: Experiences and perceptions of workplace responses to domestic and family violence](#). When victim-survivors of DFV were asked what they'd most like us to influence about workplace responses to DFV, respondents' top three wishes were for

3. Improved understanding and awareness of domestic and family violence
